Moose Jaw Mayor Elected Chair of City Mayors' Caucus

Mayors from Saskatchewan's cities have elected Moose Jaw Mayor Fraser Tolmie as chair of the Saskatchewan City Mayors' Caucus(CMC).

Tolmie was elected during the City Mayors' Caucus meeting being held in Regina today.

As chair, the Moose Jaw mayor will also represent Saskatchewan's cities on the Executive Committee and Board of Directors for the Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association (SUMA).

"It is an honour to serve as chair of the City Mayor's Caucus and Vice-President of Cities on SUMA's Executive Committee and Board of Directors," said Mayor Tolmie. "I look forward to representing Saskatchewan's cities as we work to shape our communities for a better future."

Tolmie succeeds Mayor of Yorkton Bob Maloney, who served as CMC chair from 2016-18. The chair of the committee is elected for a two-year-term.

Elected to serve as vice-chair is City of Lloydminster Mayor Gerald Aalbers.

The City Mayors' Caucus brings together the mayors of Saskatchewan's 16 cities, offering a forum to discuss issues of common concern and an opportunity to project a strong and unified voice on the most important and pressing local and provincial issues facing municipalities.

Today, revenue sharing dominates the conversation as mayors discuss proposed changes and meet with Government Relations Minister Warren Kaeding and Assistant Deputy Minister Keith Comstock.

City representatives are also discussing issues including cannabis legalization, amendments to *The Cities Act*, and the municipal election date.
