Asset Management on Agenda for Saskatchewan’s Northwest Hometowns

Municipal leaders from 18 hometowns in northwest Saskatchewan gathered in Maidstone October 4 to discuss the matters important to their communities.

The topic of asset management dominated the conversation at the Northwest Regional Meeting hosted by the Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association (SUMA).

“Residents depend on hometown infrastructure to access clean water, remove waste, travel throughout the community, and more,” said Richard Beck, Northwest Regional Director and councillor for the City of Warman. “Asset management helps make the most of this infrastructure, fostering resilient and thriving communities.”

Representatives also discussed topics including revenue sharing and cannabis legalization.

The Northwest Regional Meeting was one of seven regional meetings hosted by SUMA from September 26 – October 4.
